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#### Minutes of the Council Meeting of

held at 7.30pm on Thursday, 18th May 2023

at the Church Room, Church Rd, Potten End, HP4 2QY

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23/052	<b>Councillors' acceptance of office</b> were signed and witnessed by the Proper Officer for all Councillors present at the meeting.	
23/053	53 Election of Chair and Vice Chairs.	
	<b>Resolved</b> to elect Cllr Burfot as Chair and Cllrs Grimsdale (who had previously indicated his willingness to stand) and Westenholz-Smith as Vice Chairs. Agreed unanimously. Cllrs Burfot and Westenholz-Smith signed acceptances of office witnessed by the Proper Officer.	
23/054	Apologies for absence were received and accepted from Cllrs Brennan and Grimsdale.	
23/055	<b>Declaration of interests</b> – Cllr Burfot declared an interest with regard to item 23/058.a.	
23/056	Minutes	
	<b>Resolved</b> that the minutes of the meeting of the Council at 7.30pm on the 20 <sup>th</sup> April 2023 as circulated to members be signed as a correct record. Agreed unanimously.	
23/057	<b>Police</b> - two members of the police attended the meeting and reported that there had been two recent instances of criminal damage in the parish. Vehicle theft across the country was particularly high and although Hemel was affected the parish wasn't; residents were asked to take particular care regarding keyless cars. Parking in the parish was discussed and Cllr Douris undertook to ask Dacorum Parking Enforcement to visit the area around the school either at drop-off or pick-up time.	

#### 23/058 Public Issues

- **a.** It was suggested that two possible uses of the CIL money were either to create a footpath alongside the pond or to extend the pavement on Hempstead Lane to the Burial Ground.
- **b.** With regard to 23/059.a representations were made with regard to the distress caused by the grass cutting at the Burial Ground.

#### 23/059 Correspondence received

a. Burial Ground grass cutting – emails had been received from two people expressing concern at issues arising from cutting grass on graves at the burial ground. The Council accepted the distress caused although noting that this was the first time any issues had

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arisen and that there were mitigating factors. The Council undertook to see what action could be taken to prevent this happening again.

- **b.** Dog poo concern had been expressed at the amount of dog poo specifically along Hempstead Lane and on the Green. Agreed to raise it using the various communication channels.
- **c.** Speeding on Water End Lane noted that the Clerk had replied explaining where responsibility for controlling speeding lay and what action the Parish Council had taken.

## 23/060 General matters outstanding - none not covered elsewhere in the agenda

23/061 Parish Warden – stakes and bunting had been erected for the Picnic on The Green and taken down afterwards. The mattress springs dumped on the sports field had been removed. Grass cutting had commenced. A grave had been topped-up with soil on the Burial Ground and the water butts topped-up. Some of the wetpour under the play equipment was constituting a trip hazard and would be repaired. The slow down sign opposite Olivers Cloe was choked with ivy which would be removed; if it still didn't work Cllr Douris would try to arrange for its removal.

## 23/062 Report of Traffic and Highways Working Party

- a. Outstanding issues
  - **i. Speed monitoring location on the Green** Cllr Douris undertook to raise this with the Police and Crimes Commissioner.
  - **ii. DriveSafe signs at entrance to the village** the DriveSafe team were to raise this with the Police and Crimes Commissioner.
- b. Upcoming road works noted as presented to members.
- c. Speed limit on The Common Cllr Douris advised that the plans to involve the reduction in speed limit to 40mph along The Common included the removal of the central white line and the introduction of 'sharks teeth' and a white line along the edge of the road which along with a village entry gate would give the appearance of narrowing the road and should reduce speed. The work should be completed this financial year.
- **d.** Hempstead Lane sinkhole the sinkhole had been partially filled so that new drainage could be installed before the hole was completely filled. The pavement would be reopened shortly and the road would be partially re-opened as soon as possible, although disruption to vehicles was likely to last 6 months as further work was undertaken to improve drainage.
- **e. Speed Indicator Device** note that a third SID has been installed on Water End Rd thanks to a grant from the Police and Crimes Commissioner.

## 23/063 Report and Update from the Open Spaces and Leisure Working Party

- **a. Noticeboard** agreed to obtain competitive quotes for a new noticeboard outside Cedar large enough to accommodate community and Parish Council literature.
- **b. Picnic on The Green** noted that the event had been a success and that the Lottery Grant would cover the costs.
- **c. National Trust** noted that the NT was looking at ways to control road-side parking and damage to verges, particularly on Monument Drive. The Visitor Centre is to be refurbished but not extended. The Clerk was asked to circulate notes of the February NT meeting.
